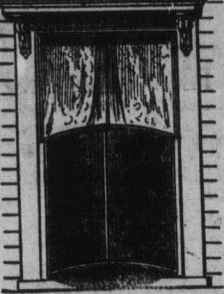

## BOY PLAYING BALL KILLED BY LIGHTNING

Lee Goodspeed of Penniac,  
Aged Seventeen, Loses  
His Life.

## SEVERAL OTHERS WERE INJURED

Still Others More or Less Af-  
fected By Terrific Bolt.

Fredericton, July 17.—Lee, the sec-  
ond son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles N.  
Goodspeed, of Penniac, aged 17 years,  
was instantly killed at that place,  
last night, by lightning while playing  
as third baseman for the Penniac  
baseball team against Maryville. The  
fatal bolt was accompanied by a ter-  
rific crash of thunder. No rain  
was falling at the time.  
The electric discharge struck the  
young man on the right side of the  
head, and passing across his body,  
entered the ground at his left foot.  
His clothing was torn practically off  
him and his boots also.  
The hair on the right side of the  
head was singed and the flesh there  
and on the body was discolored.

Several Stunned.  
Several Maryville players were  
frightened by the lightning. Herbert  
Collings had the hair on his head  
burned; a ball player and Robert  
Stafford were stunned by the same  
bolt.

Some 75 people of Maryville, pen-  
niac and neighboring places were  
gathered to the game and all wit-  
nessed the tragedy. A number were  
more or less affected by the electrical  
discharge.

The deceased is survived by his  
parents, five brothers and four sisters.  
The thunderstorm was very severe  
but Frederick escaped the worst of  
it. The Nashua Valley, in which  
Penniac is situated, usually receives  
the heaviest part of electrical storms  
in this section of the country.
