

CAHAN, CHARLES HAZLITT, B.A., LL.B. (*Shelburne.*)

Grands. of Charles Cahan who came from Newry, Irel. in 1824 to St. John, N.B., and subsequently removed to Yarmouth, N.S. B. at Hebron, Yarmouth, and ed. at Yarmouth Seminary, Dalhousie Coll., and Dalhousie School of Law. M. 1887, Mrs. Mary J. Hetherington. Was for a time a teacher in Yarmouth Seminary. Is now a journalist and on staff of *Morning Herald*. First returned to House of Assembly at last g.e. Is leader of the Opposition. A Liberal Conservative.—15 *Inglis St., Halifax, N.S.*

CAMERON, ALEXANDER F. (*Guysboro'.*)

Father was a native of Lochaber, Inverness-shire, Scot. B. 3 Oct., 1860. Ed. at Sherbrooke School, and at a Commercial Coll. in Halifax. M., 25 May, 1882, Edith J. Fraser. Is a merchant and lumberer. Has been a Municipal Councillor and Warden for two years of St. Mary's, Guysboro'. First returned to House of Asssem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Sherbrooke, Guysboro', N.S.*

CAMERON, WILLIAM. (*Pictou.*)

Paternal grandfather emigrated to Pictou from Inverness, Scot., about 1801, and maternal grandfather emigrated from same place about 1790. B. at Sutherland's River, Pictou, 25 Sept., 1847. Ed. at Dalhousie Coll., Halifax, and graduated B.A. 1873. M. at Little Harbor, Jan., 1882, Mary Catherine Dawson. Taught school for some years, and was for a time Principal of High Schools of Westville, River John and Bridgewater. A farmer. First returned to the Ho. of Assembly by acclamation, 8 March, 1887, to fill vacancy caused by resignation of the sitting member Mr. A. C. Bell. Re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Sutherland's River, Pictou Co., N.S.*

CHISHOLM, CHRISTOPHER, P. (*Antigonish.*)

Of Highland Scotch descent. B. at Clydesdale, Antigonish N.S. April 1854. Ed. at St. Francis Xavier Coll. M. 26 June 1890 Sarah, dau. of Arch. Campbell Esq. Is a Barrister and Recorder of Antigonish. First returned to Ho. of Assembly at bye election held 7 April 1891. A Liberal.—*Antigonish, N.S.*
