LEON, JACQUES. (City of Ottawa.)

B. in Montreal, 23 Oct. 1849. Ed. at Baugasse's College, Picard, Co. of Vendreuil. M. Aug. 1870; Marie, Alexandrine, Victoire, Georgetown, dau. of J. P. M. La Cour, Esq., Architect. Is a member of the Royal Soc. of Can. Edited *Le Canada*, a bi-weekly Ottawa paper, in 1867-68. Acted as joint editor of the *Montreal Mirror*, the leading French conservative organ of Quebec, from 1869 to March 1872, and as ed. of *Le Ren. Canadien*, a monthly review, to which he has contributed many essays on literature, history and political economy. Was for a time Asst. French translator of the House of Commons. In 1872 visited England, Belgium, France, Switzerland and Italy, and published a detailed account of his extensive tour. Was elected Presid. of the French Canadian Institute, Ottawa, in 1872 and 1873. Elected Presid. of the St. Jean Baptiste Society, Ottawa, in 1875 and 1876. One of the founders and ed. of the Ottawa French Canadian Building Society. Elected Presid. of the Quebec Press Assoc., 1881. Has been a frequent lecturer before national and literary socs. here and in the United States, and has published several works of importance, among others: *Philémon Wright, on Colonisation et Commerce de Bois* (1871), an essay on the establishment and development of the Ottawa region; *Le chemin de fer Canadien Pacifique* (1872), the first French elaborate essay on the Canadian Pacific Railway; *La Vallée de l'Outaouais* (1872), a pamphlet on the Ottawa Valley, its resources, agricultural and mineral, its lumber trade, its railways and canals, partly reproduced in *Le Tour du Monde* (Paris), July, 1875); *Les Canadiens de l'Ouest* (1878). Declined candidature in 1874. First returned to Parl. at g.e. 1878, and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative. Ottawa.
