WHITE, Hon. NATHANIEL WHITWORTH, Q.C.* (*Shelburne*.)

S. of Rev. Dr. White, Rural Dean and Rector of Shelburne, N.S., and grands. of the late Capt. Gideon White, of the 4th, or Duke of Cumberland's Regiment, who sat for Barrington in the N.S. House of Assembly from 1789 to 1793. A lineal descendant of Peregrine White, first white child born in New England, who was the grandchild of the then Bishop of Exeter. B. at Shelburne, N.S., 2 June 1837. Ed. there. M., 1st, 15 Aug. 1860, Mary, third dau. of the late Joshua Snow, Esq., of Shelburne, (she died); 2nd, Fannie S., eldest dau. of the late Rev. Dr. DeWolfe. Called to the Bar N.S., 1859; created Q.C. 26 Dec. 1872. Apptd. mem. of the Ex. Council of N.S., 22 Oct. 1878. First returned to Local House, for Co. of Shelburne, in Feb. 1878. Re-elected at last g.e. Liberal Conservative.—*Shelburne, Co. Shelburne, N.S.*
