

said lot of ground shall have been so purchased as aforesaid, to build and erect on the same, a suitable and convenient Market-House with Stalls in such manner as shall appear to them best suited to the public convenience, and the same may let out to hire, for the purpose of selling and exposing butchers' meat and other provisions, as sold in the Stalls of other Markets in the said City of Montreal, for such rent as may be deemed just and reasonable and as can be procured for the same.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if any person shall, either through negligence, or wilfully destroy, spoil or injure any part of the said Market-House, Stalls or other work or works thereunto belonging and appertaining, which shall be built or erected on the said lot of ground, pursuant to this Act, every person so offending shall for the first offence, incur a penalty of
and for the second and every subsequent offence, shall incur a penalty of
currency, and such further and other sum, in either of the above cases, as any two Justices of the Peace, before whom the information may be laid in their Weekly Sessions, shall consider a reasonable compensation to the said Corporation for the damage done by the person or persons so offending, and in default of payment, within fifteen days after the rendering of the judgment, the said Justices of the Peace are hereby authorized to commit the person or persons so offending to the House of Correction or to the Common Gaol, for a space of time not exceeding
days.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Corporation shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, at any meeting assembled for the purpose, after at least two weeks previous notification to that effect, in some of the News-Papers printed and published at the City of Montreal, to make and establish such Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations for the good government of the said Market-Place, not being contrary to the Rules and Regulations of Police for the said City of Montreal, nor to the Laws of this Province, as the majority of the Proprietors may deem expedient, which Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations being submitted to, and approved by his Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal, in term, or to any two Justices of the said Court in vacation, and by them approved, shall thereafter have effect and be in force.

Corporation may make bye laws, not contrary to the rules of Police, nor to the Laws of this Province.
