

## Conference to Examine Mating Habits of Gerbils

An upcoming conference to be held from April 30, to May 2, 1994 at the WU Conference Centre will examine such topics, among others, as the effects of loud music on the mating habits of domesticated gerbils.

Sponsored by the UNB Department of Extension and Needless Personal Development, the conference will be the first of its kind in Canada.

Four renowned international experts on gerbils and their mating habits will be the guest speakers for the four-day event.

As well, gerbil lovers of all ages will be invited to take part in a gerbil mating awareness session on Saturday, May 2 at 9:00am. There will be a gerbil clown for the children and parents are encouraged to bring a pot-luck dish which includes gerbil food as one of its major ingredients. Children are asked to bring a toilet-paper tube to give to the gerbils for fodder.

One guest speaker, Dr. Daniel DeDouceur, will speak on the ef-

fects of loud music on the mating habits of domesticated gerbils. He thinks that under certain circumstances, gerbils will keep their rhythm in sync with the music they are mating to.

"For example, I've found that those little buggers take a liking to music with a lot of rhythm, like Bob Marley or something. Their litters, as a result, tend to be slightly more numerous and they produce relatively larger offspring," said Dr. DeDouceur.

Other speakers include Reverend Louis Parter, who will speak upon the ethics of mating sibling gerbils. Is it creating a breed of unhealthy, low gene-pooled animals?

"Personally, I wouldn't want to mate with my sister. I mean, she's pretty enough I guess. And her figure's not too bad, but I'd feel pretty guilty. So think of those poor little horny gerbils. They're all dressed up with nowhere to go, if you see my reference," said Reverend Parter.

Dr. Kay Reality has spent the bulk of her adult life examining gerbils in the wild. She is the author of the best-seller, "How Gerbils Keep Sand Out of Their Fur." She will

read an excerpt of the book that made her known the world over as the "Gerbil Lady."

"Before mating, gerbils will lick each others fur to rid them of any grits of sand which may impede their mating enjoyment. This doubles, of course, as a form of gerbil foreplay," she explained.

Since 1975, gerbils have become one of the more popular pets for Canadians. These loveable, easy-to-keep animals survive for days on little water or food, and recycle toilet-paper tubes to make their nests from.

Gerbils have, until recently, been unknown to North Americans. They do no smell as originally thought by many Canadians, and they enjoy people and attention. They eat a diet of seeds and grains, and drink water in moderation.

Gerbil excrement are small hard turds which are extremely easy to clean up. Since gerbils do not consume much water, they urinate relatively little as well. When they do, it is absorbed into the softness of their nests, which require changing once every month or so when their cages are cleaned.

# Mayor Rescued From Icy River

Fredericton Mayor Brad Woodshed was hauled from the frigid waters of the mighty Saint John River after falling in on Thursday afternoon.

The adjustable 4-piece Phillips screwdriver, originally \$5.99, is now \$3.99, not \$3.95 as was printed in our flyer.



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## The Human Sexuality Tax

How does the cigarette tax cut affect the HST?

Unfortunately, in today's world, the underground economy is everywhere. We urge you not to stop screwing, but be responsible. Check your partner for the HST Tax Stamp (located in the cleavage or buttocks area) before sexual activity.

### What is the HST

The Human Sexuality Tax is a \$1.25 surcharge levied on sexual relations between consenting adults.

### Why a tax on sex?

Because cigarettes and alcohol are already taxed to the hilt. Sex is the only central pleasure we haven't touched yet.

### How do I pay the HST?

After relations you and your partner are each required to fill out a separate T69 Form and return it with a cheque for \$1.25 to Revenue and Taxation Canada. The forms are available At Post Offices, drug stores, and in the washrooms of many bars and dance clubs.

### What if I don't, uh...get there?

The tax only applies if you achieve climax. So relax, go to it, when you wanna do it. Relax, when you wanna come.

### What if I like little boys?

The HST only applies to consenting adults. Pedophiles and necrophiliacs are not required to pay the tax. Zoophiliacs and gerbil enthusiasts are also exempt.

### What about safe sex?

Health and Welfare Canada advises the use of a condom to prevent sexually transmitted diseases. If you use a condom, you are eligible for an HST rebate equal to 40% of its cost. Retain the receipt and the used condom, and enclose both with your Federal Income Tax Return to receive the full rebate.

### I'm from Quebec, do I pay more?

No, in fact you pay less. The HST is regionally adjusted to account for socio-cultural variation in the frequency of sexual relations. Persons from Etobicoke, for example, are required to pay an additional \$0.17 per encounter to make up for their lack of activity. Similarly, residents of Gaspé Bay may deduct \$0.76 from their payment.
