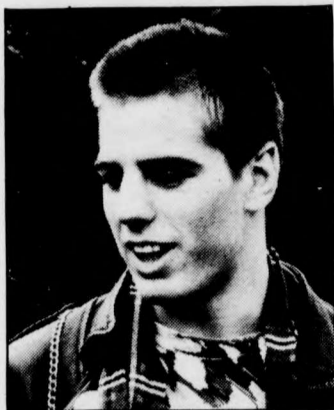

"None whatsoever. All these peaceniks are running around but no one is listening. We need political anarchy."



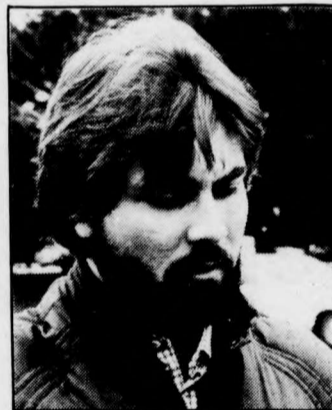
Suzanne Elbrond, FA II
