Soviet relations. H.M.Government in Great Britain greatly appreciate the prompt consideration of the position by H.M.Government in Ganada and the resulting action. We will, of course, let you know at once of the result of the debate in the House of Commons to-day. If the note is delivered, of which text was telegraphed yesterday, would it be your Ministers desire that further note should be sent by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the Soviet Charge d'Affaires intimating that he is desired by H.M. Government in Canada to inform him that they regard the arrangement made in notes exchanged on July 3rd 1922 as no longer having effect, and if so, would they wish any addition should be made as regards the matter referred to in the last sentence of your telegram.
