I know that I am imposing on your
generosity in troubling you at the present time, but

I first introduce myself - as a son of a former
friend and political associate of yours. The late S. J. Sullivan.
It is by reason of this friendship and association that I
venture to trouble you, and ask for your help.

Like most other young men, I am distressed
by the fact that I have as yet found no opportunity of
briny of any service in this war in which we are
supposed to be taking part. I need not go into details -
The same situation prevails throughout the entire country.
We have offered ourselves, but with no result. I
hoped that, at last, when we have "national mobilization"
something would come: but nothing yet. That is only
a week old, it is true - but we have waited since

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
