When faced with facts of human misery, the Canadian people will want to continue to do what they can for those who are less favoured than themselves throughout the world. There is no man or woman among us who confronted with a starving child would not happily share his food.

It so happens that in this instance it is vital to our own well-being as a nation that we ease the suffering of others. We could not long as a nation remain prosperous and healthy in a sick world. We have an interest of a purely selfish kind in seeing that prosperity, security and peace are restored over as large an area of the world as possible. This is necessary in order that we may resume normal commercial relations. Canada's interest in the restoration of two-way mutually profitable trade is greater than that of any other nation.

One possible means of making the wheat we use in Canada go further is to increase the proportion of flour extracted from a bushel of wheat from about 72 per cent of the wheat to about 80 per cent, which might appear to save 7 or 8 per cent of the wheat used for domestic consumption. Possible delays and slower rates of production due to the change-over may offset some of this possible saving.

Also the 28 per cent of this wheat grain we don't use for flour is now sold at low prices for mill feed for cattle and hogs.
