

North York township, which gave a Conservative majority of 615 in 1930, was added to the riding. The Conservative candidate's position, therefore, has been improved as follows:

With regard to the provinces of Saskatchewan and Quebec, no agreement was reached. In both these provinces the map of the Government represented such a glaring gerrymandering of constituencies that the members from these provinces, ~~on the committee~~ and their fellow members in the Commons, could not agree to the Government's map. The kind of thing that was done in Saskatchewan can perhaps be best explained by the riding which I now have the honour to represent.
