Hawthorne, L.S.E. (R.C.), in portions of the Detention Barracks other than the Warder's office.

Whilst employed as Warder in charge of the Detention Barracks, at Work Point Barracks, Esquimalt, B.C., on or about the 1st April, 1928, did allow Miss Grace BUCHANAN to enter and remain in the cell with a prisoner, namely No. 3022, Trooper J. Hawthorne, L.S.E. (R.C.)

in that he,

Whilst employed as Warder in charge of the Detention Barracks at Work Point Barracks, Esquimalt, B.C., on or about the 1st April, 1928, did permit a prisoner, namely No. 3022, Trooper J. HAWTHORNE, L.S.E. (R.C.), to move about the Detention Barracks when such prisoner should have been locked in his cell
