

(Semiahmoo)

This is the only money the Indians have received for this right of way. We ask that we have the use of this money for the band, or that it be distributed among the members of the band. We can use the money in several ways for the benefit of the band, and for the improvement of our places."

(8) "The Canadian Customs has had for several years a small piece of land in one corner of the reserve. It is leased at \$1.00 per month. We have never received any of this rent, and no explanation has been given to us by the Agents. We desire to know where the money has gone - whether to Ottawa or elsewhere, and how much there is now to our credit."

(9) "The medical attendance given by the Indian Department to the Indians of Semiahmoo, Chilliwack and neighborhood is not satisfactory, and the Indians of these places think there should be some improvement made. Dr. Henderson the Department doctor is an old doctor whom the Whites consider out of date. Both Whites and Indians lack faith in his ability, and therefore he is not patronized. Dr. Henderson lives in Chilliwack. He has no auto - only an old rig - so he takes a long time to get to outlying places. The Indians think that they are entitled to proper medical care, and the services of an up to date man such as Dr. Patterson or some other. Also the Semiahmoo Indians who live quite a distance from Chilliwack think that it would be better to have a doctor doing Indian work who lived closer to them - say perhaps at Cloosdate. This would be better in emergency cases."
