The village has one mail daily. Mansonville is also a port of entry, the Collector of Inland Revenue also has his office here. There is a Commissioner's Court for the trial of small causes. Distance from Mansonville Station $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles; North Troy, Vt., $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles; Richford, Vt., 16 miles; Vale Perkins, 5 miles; Bolton Springs, 8 miles. Population 250.

SUTTON.
