adds greatly to the appearance of the place. There are two saw mills, one flouring mill, Catholic, Episcopal and Methodist Churches, free Reading-Room and a Model and Elementary school. The citizens, with commendable enterprise, have built a private telephone line between here and Vale Perkins on the shore of Lake Memphremagog. There is also a telegraph office here. The village has one mail daily. Mansonville is also a port of entry, the Collector of Inland Revenue also has his office here. There is a Commissioner's Court for the trial of small causes. Distance from Mansonville Station 2½ miles; North Troy, Vt., 4½ miles; Richford, Vt., 16 miles; Vale Perkins, 5 miles; Bolton Springs, 8 miles. Population 250.
