The camp now numbers over two thousand men and they are a fine lot of husky and determined young men who will play the game of war just so conscientiously and willingly, when they see their duty before them as others who enlisted voluntarily.

Young men of 19 years of age are now registering, today being the last day in which they can do so. They are not likely to be called out until July and even then, some may obtain leave of absence for a while if they are the only son or sole support of a widowed mother.
