DUNDONALD.

The Ottawaa Citizen, which is well informed in respect to Lord Dundonald's intentions, so far as Canada is concerned, gives us this information: Now that Lord Dundonald has left

Canada, the Liberal press is assiduously spreading the report that he proposes to return to Canada and run for parliament.

As a matter of fact Lord Dundonald has not the slightest intention of entering Canadian politics, or of acepting a nomination for parliament. He made that perfectly clear before he left, and will give the report an emphatic deniaal as soon as the fact that (contraband of war, which shall be his mame is being used in that con-binding upon every country. nection reaches him. The intention of the government press in spreading the report is obvious. It is desired to create the impression that Lord Dundonald is a partisan in Canadian politics, whereas his interest in Canada and in the militia of this country is of a purely imperial and patroitic

The probabilities are good that the imperial government will exhibit its confidence in and appreciation of the general by appointing him to a high command under the new army council scheme which is now going into effect. Premier Balfour has already announced that such was the government's intention prior to the trouble arising here between Lord Dundonald and the Canadian government, and we are satisfied that when the entire facts are in the possession of the imperial authorities the result will be to still further convince them of the general's fitness for a high command.

WILL THE UNITED STATES SUB-MIT?

The Russian prize court at Vladivostock has given a decision in the case of the steamer Arabia, captured by the Russian cruiser Gromoboi. The Arabia is a British ship, but carried a cargo of flour consigned by Americans to Japanese ports. The prize court orders the confiscation of the flour, laying down a principle which no other nation has affirmed in recent times, namely, that provisions are contraband of war. The United States cannot consistently submit to this ruling. In 1793, when war was being waged in Europe, she resisted the attempt to make foodstuffs contraband, except when consigned to a blockaded port, or obviously for military use. She has never receded from that position, but has continually asserted it. In the Boer war when a cargo of flour consigned by Amly asserted it. In the Boer war when a British cruiser seized a cargo of American foodstuffs in Delagoa Bay, the United States demanded and was at once awarded damages.

Great Britain is in accordance with the United States on this question. Their interests are mutual. Last year the United States shipped to the British market \$160,000,000 worth of provisions. If Great Britain were at war with any European power, this enormous commerce world be imperiled if the Russian doctrine prevailed. Every vessel under an American or any neutral flag, carrying foodstuffs to Great Britain for consumption by the British people, would be liable to confiscation of cargo. It is plain, therefore, that neither the United States nor Great Britain can afford to allow the decision of the Vladivostock prize court to pass into international law. The confiscation would have been regular had it been shown that the cargo of the Arabia was intended for the troops in Manchuria and Korea, but the Russians seem to have acted on the assumption that the destination of the cargo to a Japanese port was in itself sufficient ground for confiscation. The United States last year shipped \$12,000,000 · worth of wheat and flour to Japan, so that

lyzed during the continuance of the war, if the Russian decision holds. Great Britain has already entered a protest against the seizure of the Arabia. The United States, to be consistent, cannot allow the confiscation of the cargo to go unchallenged. In declaring coal to be contraband of war Russia stands alone, but the inclusion of provisions in the list of contraband is even more intolerable. No action can be a law unto itself in such matters. Effacing Tattoo Marks.

Many persons who desire to get rid of india ink marks on the skin will be interested in the method recommended by a correspondent in a con-temporary. He says: "After making the site of operation aseptic retattoo the part with needles (secundum ar-tem), using the following solution: Chloride of zinc, thirty grams; ster-flized water, forty grams. At the time of operation the tattooing becomes rather pale, and the needle pricks appear surrounded with white. At the border of the tattooed surface a raised white edge forms, caused by the raising of the epidermis, and the neighbor-ing parts become slightly reddened. This, however, soon disappears, and with proper attention to cleanliness there is no intense reaction. In a day or two after the operation the tattooing becomes darker, the white arola be-comes yellowish, and a crusty, superfi-cial eschar forms, which separates on the fifth to the tenth day. It is not in any way painful, and the results, remote as well as immediate, are excel
