is due to our economic system. Since the introduction of labor-saving machinery on a large scale employment has become less certain and the purchasing power of men's wages has steadily decreased. This has driven many young men to seek an unstable life in hotels and saloons rather than face the sacrifices of comfort and pecuniary security which would be involved in marriage. Then again, as the married man's wages come less and less proportionate to his needs, first his boys and finally his daughters and in many cases, his wife, have to go into the labor market to help supply the family's food and pay the rent. These women and children work more cheaply than men and, in the end, cut down on their wages in many lines of industry and in many other lines displace men altogether. This decreases the ability of men to support families and render it necessary for the women to keep on working 20 or 30 hours of their homes. And, due no doubt to such conditions many men drift into immoral channels. The wretchedly poor pay thousands of women who try to earn a living respectably but find that virtue is the only reward of such a course and whose natural desire is to better their circumstances, renders them necessarily susceptible to the lure of the seducer and kidnapper.

Why do you give back to factories rather than take employment as domestic in safe and sheltered home? Because of the social inferiority they are too often made to feel. If girls were used as servants and made to feel at home the servant problem would not be such a bad one. But as long as servants are used as they generally are, so long will girls prefer the harder and more generous but more congenial life of the crowded factory in spite of the dangers and pitfalls of unchaperoned city life.

Outside of a revival of faith, always necessary before any reform or revolution is complete, the remedy for immorality is economic. Give-over to the full value of his work and his family relations will not, unless they wish to do so, have to look for work outside their own homes. Our economic system and the religious ideas we have founded upon it are wrong. Only the spirit of brotherhood and cooperation duly fostered by the earlier prophets and fully taught by Jesus and His disciples can save the world. The individualist theory of everyone for himself has failed and can never succeed. All for each and each for all is the better way. Not until the spirit of Jesus dominates society will the objects of social and moral reform be achieved—poverty abolished, crime and suffering reduced to a minimum and the Kingdom of God established upon the earth.
