



SCOTLAND **EMPRESS** OF THE

The Canadian Pacific Steamships, lices "Empress of Scotland" has been chartered by Frank C. Clark, New York, for a cruise of b6 days to the Mediterranean, calling at the varius European ports. She left Ne e York on February 4th, with even berth booked. This spring the "Empress of Scotland" will carry on a regular service between Quèbec, Cherbourn, Southampton and Hamburg. She is scheduled to leave Quebec on her-first outward journey from Canada early in May. The "Empress of Scotland" is the largest vessel in the Atlantic fleet of the Canadian Pacific, and one of the most Invarious vessels in the service This stamptic her to

This steamship has re-cently undergone a very connre-hensive overhaul and has been adapted for burning oil fuel instead of coal. Her Second Class pas-senger accommodation has been in-creased and immored. Her Third Class accommodation has also been greatly improved, a new Third Class Dining Saloon having been arranged at the forward end of the ship, to-pether with a Lounge and Smoke Room, and an additional Third Class Dining Saloon arranged aft. The boating capacity has been brought up to the most modern standard new davits having been brought throughout, and new boats of the latest collapsible type fitted under each existing lifeboat, these life-boats also having been completely overhauled and made good.
