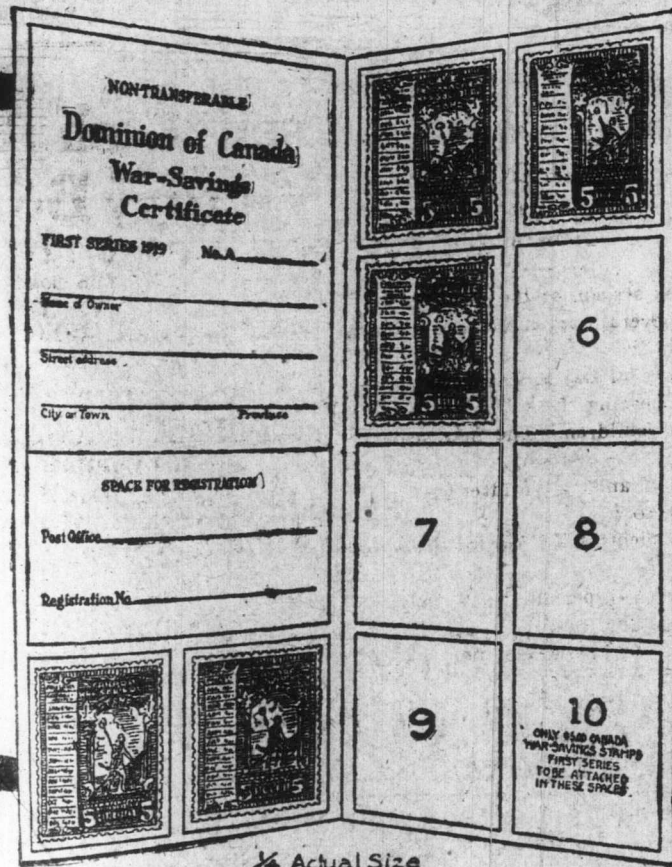

## WORK CEASES AND MUNICH IS IN TURMOIL

Complete Anarchy Reigns in the City—Looters are Busy and Troops Desert in Large Numbers.

London, April 17.—Complete anarchy reigns in Munich, according to a Copenhagen dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company. All work has ceased, trains are not running and robbers are looting houses and threatening the banks, the dispatch states. The first infantry regiment is said to have joined the Spartacists.

Copenhagen, April 17.—German government troops occupied the entire town of Madgeburg Tuesday, according to a Weimer dispatch to the Local Anzeiger of Berlin. It is reported there was hard fighting with many casualties on both sides.

Berlin, April 17.—The Battle in Munich for the central railway station ended in the complete defeat of the government troops, according to Nuremberg advices.

Munich again is completely in the hands of the Communists, according to the Tageblatt, but troops loyal to the government have received reinforcements and are using artillery against the Communist stronghold in the Central Railway station.

Street fighting in the Bavarian capital is increasing. Many civilians have been killed or wounded.

Reinforcements for the loyal troops are being hurried to Munich from various parts of Bavaria.

The Communist force in Munich, the newspaper adds, consists of parts of the garrison, red guards and unemployed. The Government forces are declared to be having a hard battle with them.

The Government has declined to enforce a food blockade against Munich, owing to the distress it would cause in the city.

Paris, April 17.—Direct news from Bavaria is still lacking in peace conference circles. The overnight developments reported in the press, however, caused less confidence to be felt than previously that the Scheidmann government would be able to control the situation.

An American mission comprising Messrs. Ellis, Gresel, Lithgow and Osborn, with a force of clerks, will leave for Berlin for the purpose of keeping the American peace delegation informed of events.

Bridgeburg, April 16.—Work was begun at the yards of the Canadian Allis-Chalmers Company here today on two additional ships of the "war-weasel" type. Two have already been built, one of which has been launched.

The big drawback at the Allis-Chalmers plant, which officials pointed out recently, is now being removed, the Bridgeburg Council last night deciding to appeal to the Ontario Housing Commission for aid to local families, covering the erection of a number of houses. The Council held a special meeting at which application was made for financial assistance by a number of lot owners.

The starting of work at the shipyards on additional ships will keep the 300 men employed there now busy for some time to come.

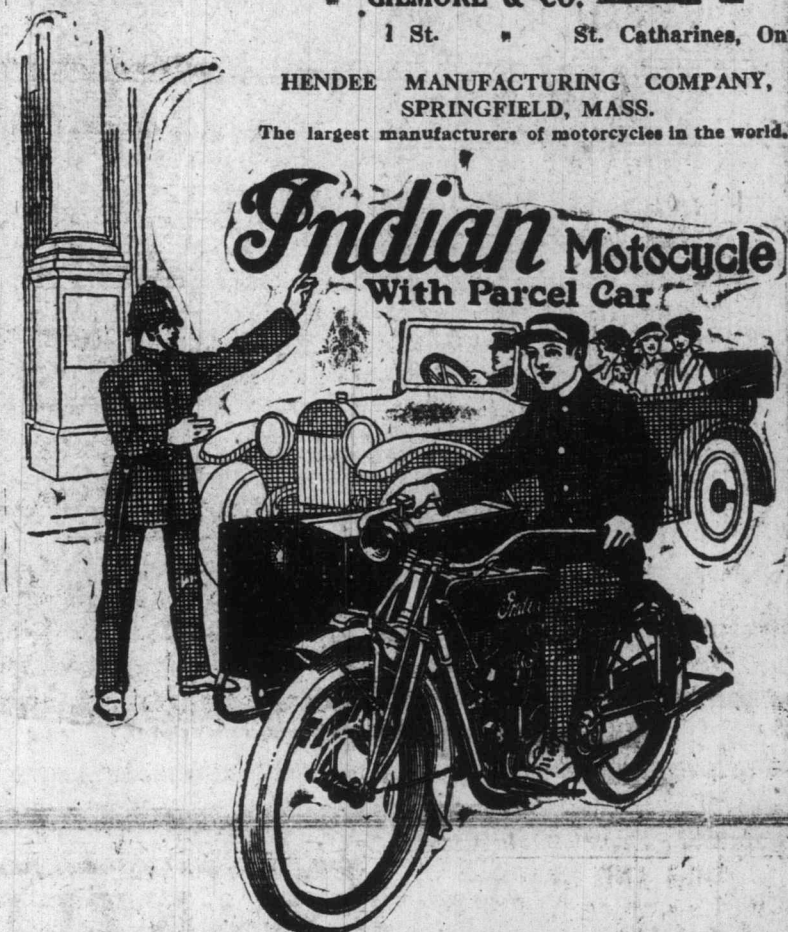

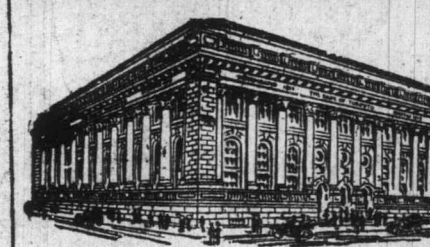
