It has been re-established on a new basis, and we do not only expect to receive a continuance of the patronage so generously extended to the paper in the past, but we hope to make the acquaintance of thousands of new readers, and thus enlarge the sphere of its usefulness to an extent never yet attained by any local journal.

In politics there is no disposition on the part of the management to lend the HERALD indiscreetly to any party. But, believing as we do, that the best interests, not only of the Dominion at large, but of this Province as well, will be promoted by retaining the Liberal-Conservative party in power, we shall accord a generous support to both the present Dominion and Local Governments. Under the wise statesmanship of Sir John Macdonald and his colleagues, Canada is making grand strides in the path of progress and prosperity, and under the economical administration of the Local Government, the people of this Province have been relieved of burdens which were becoming more or less oppressive, while at the same time the efficiency of the public service has been maintained, and the expenditure kept within the limits.

All measures calculated to further the interests of this Province, or of the Dominion in general, will find in the HERALD a warm advocate, and while we shall be loath to give expression to views and opinions which we believe to be sound and correct, it shall be our aim to temper our criticisms with the spirit of fairplay. The ways and means by which our forerunners were enabled to obtain a livelihood from the virgin soil, would fall far short of meeting the agricultural requirements of these days. The time has gone by when muscular power was regarded as the chief accomplishment of the successful tiller of the soil. To-day, brain power is a much more effective agency than a strong muscle in developing every branch of the farming interest. And it is the duty of the journalist to give his countenance and support to every movement having for its object the advancement of this great industry. In the promotion of this work the HERALD will take an active part. Its columns will always be open for the discussion of matters pertaining to Agriculture; and from the best and most practical sources, selections, interesting and instructive, will be made.

The Fishing industry is only second in importance to that of Agriculture, and we shall deem it our duty to give the support of the HERALD to all measures calculated to foster and encourage it.

Though this Province can never hope to take very high rank as a manufacturing centre, still, with improved communication, winter and summer, with the outside world—which must soon come—and under the judicious policy inaugurated by the present Dominion Government, we see no good reason why many articles that are now imported could not be manufactured as cheaply and of as good quality as in any other part of Canada. Labor is not high, fuel is within easy reach of the centers of trade, and the raw material can either be produced or laid down here as cheaply as in any other Province of the Dominion. To aid in the development of our manufactures, then, will be another duty incumbent upon the HERALD.

We shall unceasingly strive to elevate the moral tone of the community, and to develop and recreate the minds of our young people. Our selections will be carefully and intelligently made, and will always tend to refine and elevate the taste.
