

A BY-LAW

Twenty, for purposes therein set forth.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Town of Goderich is at present indebted to sundry parties, for work done and to be done, for the sum of one hundred pounds; and whereas the Board of Common School Trustees, have requisition of the said Municipal Council, the sum of one hundred pounds for the erection of new School houses; and, with which demand, the Council deem it expedient to comply; and whereas the Council have taken stock in the Mailland Gravel Road Company, to the amount of two hundred and fifty pounds; and have also resolved to grade and gravel

and to make other local public improvements, within the town; at a cost of \$100,000, or a further sum of twelve hundred and fifty pounds; and, whereas it is therefore necessary and expedient to issue debentures for the amount of two thousand five hundred pounds; and whereas, for the payment of the said debentures, and the interest to become due thereon, it will be necessary to raise annually, as a special rate, over and above and in addition to all other rates

the said real sums; lastly, if there shall have been no such sale or payment as above provided, until the year 1854, 1855, 1856, or 1857, the sum of £150 : and, in the year 1858, the sum of £297½ ; whereas the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Town of Goderich, for the financial year preceeding the passing of this By Law, was £7703 18s. 6d., and whereas the value paid by the owners thereof towards the redemption of a sinking fund for the payment of the said debt, there will be required upon the said rateable property an annual rating in the pound, as follows, that is to say for the year 1853, the sum of 2¼d. in the pound, for each of the years 1854, 1855, 1856, and 1857, the sum of ¾d. in the pound, and for the year 1858, the sum of 6s. 8¼d. in the pound.

Council of the Town of Gröden in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Upper Canada Municipal Corporation Act, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this By-Law, the Mayor of the said Municipal Council shall have power to borrow, on the said sum of \$25,000, and to be authorized and empowered to issue, grant, and make debentures of the said Municipal Council for an amount not less than £25, nor exceeding in the said sum of \$25,000 for the purposes above specified; provided always, that the Mayor, for the time being, shall not issue any of the said debentures, unless he shall have obtained the previous resolution of the said Municipal Council.

And it is hereby enacted, that the said

at the office of the Treasurer of the said Municipal Council on the 30th day of December, in the year of our Lord 1858; and that the interest of the said debentures shall be payable half yearly on the 30th day of June and the 20th day of December in each year, at the office of the Treasurer as aforesaid.

And be it therefore enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that the said debentures shall be issued under the common seal of the said Municipal Council, and shall have Coupons attached to them for the payment of the said interest, and that the said Debentures shall be subject to the following articles:

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that for the payment of the said debentures and the interest thereon there shall be assessed levied, and raised upon the whole rateable property in the said Town of Goderich, as a special

and above and in addition to all other rates and whatsoever, as follows, that is to say, in the year 1853, a rate of 2d. in the pound; in each of the years 1854, 1855, 1856, and 1857 a rate of 4d. in the pound, and in the year 1858 a rate of 6s. 8d. in the pound.

And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that this By-law shall take effect and come into operation immediately after and after the passing thereof.
