ence to the saving of infant And whereas it is necessary that such Nurse should get at once into touch with all newly born infants and their mothers; on recommendation of the Acting Medical Health Officer, it is ordered that in respect of the City of St. John's the provisions of Section 8, Cap. 28, Consolidated Statutes, as amended by Section 4, Cap. 9, 1899, will be enforced. This Act provides that when any birth takes place information of the same shall be furnished or posted within forty-eight hours thereafter to the proper officer appointed to receive the same, under a fine not exceeding \$10 for every neglect to do The obligation to furnish The obligation to furnish such information rests in the first instance upon the father of the child; or, in the case of

his death or absence, upon the
