Conservatives Fail to Secure Majority in Canadian Elections--American Professor Predicts an Earthquake in New England.

STANDING OF PARTIES. TORONTO, Oct. 30. Definition election returns at eight o'clock to-night, with eight seats doubtful, gave the Conservatives 117 seats; Liberals, 97; Progressives, 20; Labor, 2; Independent, 1. The doubtful seats were Queen's, P.E.I., where the vote was tied; Wetaskiwan and Peace River, in Alberta; Kindersley, East Mountain, Maple Creek, Roseburn and Qu'Appelle, in Saskatchewan.
