## Ward Appropriation.

Ward Appropriation. The representatives in the Council of the West Ward have undoubtedly made out a strong case in favor of the additional appropriation which they have endeavored insuccessfully to obtain. The senior member has taken the trouble to compile a con-cise and complete statement, com-paring the number of voters, the as-sessment, and the length of streets in each ward, and it was read at the Council in Committee of the whole on Monday. We intended to have presented it yesterday with some re-narks, but were prevented by press of matter. Here it is :--

WEST WARD.- Number of names on voltrs' list, 492; total assessment \$684, 970; length of streets to be improved by ward appropriation, 480 chains or six mil s.

NORTH WARD .- Number of names on voters' list, 353; total assessment, \$556, 900; length of streets to be improved by ward appropriaticn, 230 chains.

Sourd appropriation, 230 chains. Sourn Wann. --Number of names on verse list, 329 ; total assessment, \$306,-050 ; length of streets to be improved by warl appropriation, 115 chains. Easr Wann.--Number of names on voters' list, 200 ; total assessment \$376,-130 ; length of streets to be improved by ward appropriation, 155 chains. The Weat Ward has therefore fix chains.

ward appropriation, 185 chains. The West Ward has therefore 65 chains more ward itricts than the East and North Wards put together, and more than one-half more than the South. Ward. If a calculation is made on the basis of the East Ward, with its 185 chains of ward streets, receiving \$200 to repair those streets, in the same propor-tion of relative length of ward streets, the North Ward \$341, and the West Ward \$519.


