Punctually at 4 o'clock the large open cars were halted at the City Hall, and a few minutes later the happy youngsters on board, being in charge of Messrs. D. S. Perrin, Samuel R. Break, Andrew Thomson, J. W. Hyman, Samuel Grigg, Superintendent Smith, Officer Joseph Sanders and Mr. Fred W. Matthews.

When the cars, which were gaily decorated with flags and banners, reached the park Mr. Arthur Cooper took a photo of the children and the committee of ladies and gentlemen as a memento of the occasion. A committee of ladies had preceded the excursion, and on the arrival of the youngsters everything was in readiness for the feast of good things. That over, a ride on the merry-go-round was given, and then the games were called, in which almost all the children secured a prize. A baseball match was played from sides chosen from the boys, under the direction of Mr. J. A. Hunt. Officer Joseph Sanders superintended the games. These over the children were conducted to the cars, when they were each given a bag of candy and taken over the line of duty to the South London terminus and back to the City Hall, where they sang "God Save the Queen" and were dismissed.
