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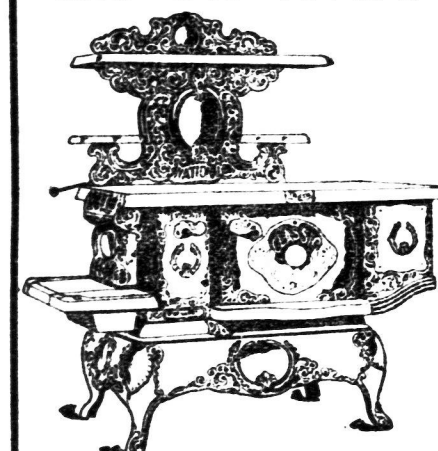

EGG SANDWICH MEN CANNOT GET TOGETHER

But Prices Will Be Boosted Just as Soon as It's Possible to Do So.

Many of the local restaurants have already raised the prices of fried and scrambled eggs from 10 cents to 15 cents, and as soon as it is practicable they intend to raise the price of egg sandwiches from 5 cents to 10 cents. The only reason that this has not been done before is that all the restaurant proprietors will not agree to do it, notwithstanding that all are agreed that there is no money in the sandwiches at the present prices of eggs. Some of the proprietors, however, contend that their customers are entitled to either a cup of coffee or a piece of pie, and while they make nothing at all on the sandwiches clear a little on the other articles.
