Italian Penal System Make Incubators for Criminality.

London, June 25.—Italy retains pecial form of banishment introduced under the Roman Emperors known as domicilio coatto, or coerced domicile. This punishment corresponds to the Roman deportatio in insulam, or deportation to an island, and like it conwithin its limits personal freedom. The penalty is generally resorted to

it is expedient to remove from large cities. Its use has become so general that at present over 5,000 criminals are at Albany. residing in the Islands of Ponza, Ven-Liperi, Ustica, Lampedusa, totene, Pantelleria, Favignana and Tremiti. These islands have practically become inhabited exclusively by crim-As they are allowed to marry or at least go through a semblance of marriage, the islands are so thickpopulated that before long it will impossible to find place for more

Naturally the deported do not lead an exemplary life and they bring up their children in such a way that sooner or later the children are bound to follow in their parents' footsteps. Thus the eight slands are aptly called incubators of

An attempt is being made to abolish deportation and to substitute a new penalty, such for instance, as tricts in order to reclaim barren land. It is unlikely that a substitute for deportation can be found unless deported criminals are sent to overcrowded prisoners or are released.


