WRECKED BY THE CARMONA.

The first trip of the season of the steamer Carmona, Capt. John Scott, last Thursday night came near being her final trip, as she was nearly wrecked.

The boat was tied up at the Charlotte N.Y., dock above the North King, and as there was not enough room for her to wing about and start for the lake, Capt. Scott started her up the river. When above the blast furnace dock a hawser was carried from her stern to the shore and fastened to a snubbing post to aid in swinging her about, as the current was very

The signal was given to go ahead and the wheel was put down. As she swung out into the current the force of the water was so great that it was imposthe water was so great that it was impos-sible to swing her around. The strain on the hawser pulled the post out of the dock and the vessel started to float broadside down the stream. As she moved along Capt. Scott noticed a number of yachts at their moorings, and in attempting to clear them the boat collided with the end of the City of Rochester, which was on the stays undergoing remains.

The stern of the City of Rochester pro-The stern of the City of Rochester protruded far over the water and the force of the collision was so great as to carry away 12 feet of the boat, snapping the stout stanchions like so many matches. Twenty feet of the bulwarks of the Carmona were also carried away and the staunch boat was given a severe shaking. As she drifted down the stream it looked as it she would collide with the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg pier, but this was luckily averted. The vessel cleared by about 10 feet, the current having carried her over towards the east pier.


