The recent visit of Assistant Counsel Greer of the roadside investigation to New York resulted in the presence in the city Saturday of Mr. Marshall D. Barr, formerly district manager of the Edison Electric Light Company in this city, but now of New York. Mr. Barr was en route to Atlanta, Georgia, but managed to spare a few hours here. He arrived in the afternoon and left again at 11 p.m. During that time, however, a special session of the court was held in Judge McLaughlin's chambers, and some interesting evidence was given by Mr. Barr.

Johnston, a former alderman, \$1000 as a retainer for his influence as an alderman, and that he subsequently in February, 1892, paid Mr. Johnston \$4000 to be divided between him and Hewitt, who had been defeated at the municipal election.

The object of Barr had in paying the money was to secure the equipment of the Toronto Railway Company at the session to-day, and he would see him and ascertain if he had any influence.

A CRISIS IN BRITISH POLITICS

GENERAL ELECTIONS MAY BE BROUGHT ON AT ONCE.

Lord Rosebery Tired of the Continual Dispute Held to Be Anxious to Retire From the Premiership—Resignation of the Ministry Looked Upon as Imminent—Harcourt the Cause of Misconduct.

New York, Dec. 16.—The Sun's London says: Several persons who are judges of English political affairs expect the general election manifesto to be issued by the Government within a week. That a crisis of some sort in the affairs of the Government is imminent is quite certain. It is no longer denied that a certain section of the cabinet favor an immediate appeal to the country.

Reports of Harcourt's defection continue to make a serious diversion in the cabinet. Lord Rosebery is interrupted several times during last night's speech by cries of "Where's Harcourt?"

It is not publicly known here that Harcourt is in the middle of the week and spent the night discussing the situation with the doughty chancellor.

The impression is gaining ground that Rosebery is anxious to retire from the Premiership. More than one event of the first importance in British politics may take place in the next few days.
