

A Point in Preserving Fruit. A very good authority on fruit preserv-ing considers that the plan followed by many housekeepers, of using a small pro-portion of sugar, and in consequence boiling the preserve longer, is a fallacy, as the more sugar the greater the bulk of preserve obtained, less being wasted in long boiling and evaporation, while the flavor of the fruit is more retained. A quick fire should be used, and, of course, the preserve has boiled long enough drop a little into a glass of cold water. If it does not spread or mix, it is done enough. Or another way is to drop a little on a plate. If it does not run on the plate, it is sufficiently boiled, and should at once be poured.


