TO STUDY ENGLISH FISHING METHODS

Arthur Boutiller, of the National Fish Company, left on the Ocean Limited for Montreal from where he will sail by the liner Andania Saturday for England.

Mr. Boutiller is making this trip to England for the purpose of studying fishing conditions in that country. He expects to remain in that country for five weeks and will spend his time visiting the various large fishing centres. To The Herald last evening, he stated that after thirty years in the fish business in this country, he felt that he had acquired a thorough knowledge with a view to seeking new ideas which might be applicable here, he intended to study the English methods.

With regard to the operations of obtaining a supply of insulin from fish, recently commenced by the National Fish Co., Mr. Boutiller stated that this new phase of the business had proved very satisfactory, and that it was his intention to carry it on on a much larger scale this coming Fall. He had been advised, he said, by the Biological Board of Canada that there were indications that insulin obtained from fish would have an advantage over any insulin from other sources, in medicine.
