So many Mission Bands have written to me asking questions about girls to support in India that I thought other Bands under the Eastern Board might be interested. The schools in Akidu under Mrs. Craig, and in Tuni under Mrs. Garside are understood to be the special care of our Eastern Bands, while the Western Board have the Cocanada School and the Samulcotta Seminary under their charge. Our Bands will understand that the pupils in these schools are often changed as some of the girls are taken from school to be married, others are prevented by various reasons from remaining long enough to finish their course. Mrs. Craig last December copied out a complete list of the girls in the Akidu School for 1893. It is as follows.
