THIS Establishment is to be a Benevolent Institution, but not as a Gratuitous Charity. It is expected that those who reside at the House, will, as a general thing, pay their board; while the stranger, the worthy objects of charity, the destitute and shipwrecked mariner, will meet with a welcome home within its doors, and share freely in its hospitalities.

## REGULATIONS,

- Relat. 1.—Morning and Evening Prayer.
- " 2.—Boarders must conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
- " 3.—Gambling or games of Chance will not be permitted.
- " 4.—Profane Swearing, or improper language shall in no case be allowed.
- " 5.—Bonging Intoxicating Liquors into the house is prohibited.
- " 6.—Bills, Periodicals or Newspapers shall not be taken from the Reading Room or defaced.
- " 7.—Persons breaking the last Five Rules, may be expelled from the Home, by the person in charge.
- Conditions of Admission.*
- " 8.—One Week's Board, payable in advance.
- " 9.—Any Seaman being Sick or Destitute, coming from a distance requiring admittance, must produce a Certificate of his own moral character, signed by some respectable Ship-master, Physician, Clergyman, or Magistrate of the locality where he last resided, or three respectable persons, if the above cannot be obtained.

Doors closed at ten o'clock, p. m.
