PEOPLE

The total Canadian population is 22,094,925.* Ontario and Quebec are the most populated provinces with approximately 7.9 million and 6.1 million people respectively.

The largest postwar inflow of immigrants to Canada was in 1957 with the arrival of 282,000.

Canada has a density of six people per square mile. Prince Edward Island, the most densely populated province, has 50 per square mile; Newfoundland, the least, 3.5.

For bachelors, the more inviting provinces might be Quebec and Ontario, each having 5,000 more women than men between the ages of 20 and 24 years.

The majority of Canadians can trace their heritage to the British Isles (9.6 million), or French ancestors (6.2 million). Canada has two official languages, English and French.

Ethnic groups, the largest numbers of which are of German, Italian, Ukranian, Dutch, Scandinavian, and Polish stock, comprise more than 26% of the population.

Native Canadians

While Eskimos and Indians make up approximately 1% of the total Canadian population, they account for 52% of the population of the Northwest
