C\$20	for Canadian dollars
US\$20	for American dollars
A\$20	for Australian dollars
£20	for British pounds
¥20	for Japanese yen
€20	for euros

Do not put a space between the number and the symbol: \$20 not \$ 20.

In WordPerfect, look under Insert/Symbol/Typographic Symbols for these currency symbols. If your word processor does not have these currency symbols, you can insert them by turning on the Num Lock key, holding down the Alt key and typing in the following ANSI codes:

¢: 0162 £: 0163 ¥: 0165 €: 0128

Although traditional symbols continue to be used to express currencies, they are to a large extent being replaced by International Organization for Standardization (ISO) currency codes.
