Pursuant to Standing Order 39(4), the following Question was made an Order of the House for a Return, namely:

No. 1,156—*Mr. Matheson*

1. How many civilian persons, by provinces, have been trained, in each year, for Civil Defence by St. John Ambulance since the inception of the Civil Defence Program?
2. How many military persons have been trained, in each year, by St. John Ambulance for the same period?
