in the Soviet Union, who now avail themselves of their ancient and undoubted right thus to present a grievance common to your petitioners in the certain assurance that Your Honourable House will therefore provide a remedy, humbly sheweth that they urge the Canadian Government to make representations to the Government of the Soviet Union concerning the release of Mykola Horbal, a Ukrainian poet, composer and musician who is now incarcertated in a Soviet concentration camp. In the opinion of the petitioners, the simple desire that people in the Ukraine enjoy the same human and national rights as do people everywhere in the free world does not constitute a criminal offence.

Wherefore the 450 signees petition for the release of Mykola Horbal, and as in duty bound, your petitioners will ever pray.
