FULL INDEXATION OF FAMILY ALLOWANCE

Mr. Vic Althouse (Humboldt-Lake Centre): Mr. Speaker, I have petitions from senior citizens clubs in LeRoy, Lanigan and Spalding protesting the effort by the Government to deindex the family allowance similar to what the Government tried to do to senior citizens pensions some time ago. They point out that the cut-backs are inequitable and unbearable in the face of budget hand-outs, such as half a million dollars in tax free capital gains taxes, greater RRSP deductions for high income recipients, millions in hand-outs to oil companies and billions of dollars in bail-outs to the banks.

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CONFLICT OF INTEREST

ESTABLISHMENT OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS REGISTER

Hon. Ray Hnatyshyn (President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, there have been the usual consultations between the Parties. I think you will find a disposition at this time, by unanimous consent and without debate, to allow passage of the item of business under Government Order No. 60 standing in my name. I move:

That the Standing Committee on Management and Members' Services consider matters related to the establishment of a Register of Members' Interests, and report on these and any other matters relating to registration of Members' interests, including the form and content of such a register, considering among other matters relating to the registration of Members' interests, the following:

- (a) remunerated directorships of companies, public or private;
- (b) other remunerated positions or offices;
- (c) remunerated trades, professions or vocations;
- (d) the names of clients when the interests referred to above include personal services by the Member which arise out of or are related in any manner to his or her membership in the House;
- (e) any payments or any material benefits or advantages received from or on behalf of foreign Governments, organizations or persons;
- (f) land and property of substantial value or from which a substantial income is derived; and
- (g) the names of companies or other bodies in which the Member has, to his or her knowledge, either himself or herself or with or on behalf of his or her spouse or dependents, any beneficial interest including—among others, shareholdings—of a nominal value greater than one-hundredth of the total capital assets of the company or other body;

and that it report on the form and content of such a Register not later than December 31, 1985; and

Provided, that notwithstanding the usual practices of this House, if the House is not sitting when the final report of the Committee is completed, the Committee shall report its findings by depositing the said report with the Clerk of the House and it shall thereupon be deemed to have been laid upon the Table.

REPORT OF THE CANADIAN COUNCIL ON SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

Question No. 266—**Mr. Young:**

1. Did the Minister of National Health and Welfare receive a report from the Canadian Council on Social Development with respect to a study on the cost effectiveness of providing alternatives to the institutionalization of mentally disabled persons and, if so, was there a dissenting opinion to the majority report and what was the nature of that opinion?
2. Does the Minister intend to initiate a pilot project to determine the cost effectiveness of providing comprehensive services to assist mentally disabled individuals to participate fully in their communities and, if so, in which community or communities will such projects be initiated and what will be the commencement and completion dates?

Hon. Jake Epp (Minister of National Health and Welfare):

1. The Canadian Council on Social Development (CCSD) has submitted to the Minister of National Health and Welfare its report on a cost effectiveness study of providing alternatives to the institutionalization of mentally disabled persons and a dissenting opinion to the report was not submitted.

2. No decision has yet been taken with respect to pilot projects.
