

good standing shall write the name of the person he selects for the office, and place the paper without signature in the ballot box. Two scrutineers specially appointed by the chairman shall report the number of votes cast for each candidate, and the candidate receiving the majority of votes shall be declared elected by the chairman. In case no candidate receives a majority of the total number of votes on the first ballot, successive ballots shall be held omitting the candidature in every case of the person or persons receiving the lowest number of votes, and continuing until one of the candidates has received a majority of the votes cast.

DEMISSION OF OFFICE.

5. In case of demission of office, whether by death, resignation, or otherwise, the vacancy thereby caused shall be filled at the next regular meeting of the Club (or at a special meeting on notice) by the election of any member to fill his place in the manner aforesaid. The person so elected shall hold office for the unexpired term of the person vacating the same.

MEMBERSHIP.

6. There shall be three classes of members—life, active, and honorary.

7. The membership shall be open to any man of at least eighteen years of age who is a British subject by birth or naturalization, and who is in sympathy with the objects of the Club.

8. Honorary membership may be conferred on on such persons wheresoever resident, as in the opinion of the Club may, for special reasons be entitled to such distinction.
