

## BULLISH EFFECT ON WHEAT PRICES

Market Firm Thru Belief That  
Crest of Big Movement  
Has Passed.

CHICAGO, Sept. 29.—Belief that the crest of the big movement of wheat in both the American and the Canadian northwest has passed, had a bullish effect today on prices here. Largely in consequence, the market closed firm at 1/2 to 1/4 net advance. Corn finished 1/2 to 1/4 net higher, and oats with a gain of 1/4 to 1/2 to 1/4 cent. In provisions, the outcome was irregular, ranging from a decline to a rise of 1/4 cent.

Weak cables caused a downward turn at the outset. This influence, however, was more than offset later by news that there is no wheat available for the first half of October shipment from either California or New Orleans.

Wet weather, encouraged corn, wheat and barley, encouraged buyers of corn. Shippers here were active to an extent that seemed to indicate the low stocks in many sections. There were also reports of much danger to corn in stock.

Oats showed independent firmness due to speculative buying of an influential sort. Sales came only from scattered sources.

Outstanding sales of October depressed wheat. Otherwise the provision market appeared to keep, chiefly in view of the upward slant of prices for hogs.
