A large stone hotel is to ho crested in Fast Selkirk next summor by Ilessrs. Barnes and Duggard.

Smitit Bros., Gladistone, lumber dealers, have dissolved partnership. The concern will in future be carried on by J. W. Smith.
Strimenson it Wiblas, stove, tin aml hardware dealers. Main street, havedissolved. Hach partucr continues in business alone.
The town plots of Burliugton and shoallake havo become amalgamated, and will hereafter be known as the town of Burlington.
SNow \& Comb, surveyors, are busily engaged in surveying islands, also the main land, on which thero are very good indications.
Adamson \& Cirampion, grocers and liquor dealers, Nelson, have dissolved partnership. The business will be continued by Mr. Champion.

Tue Cosmopolitan Hotel, un the north side o the railway track on Main strect, has only been running a counle months, and the proprictors are in difficulty already.
Ir is estimated that there are loctween threo and four thousand men employed in the lumber woods along the line of the C. P. R. East, betrocen here and Thunder Bay.
Burolirs made an unsuccessful attempt to effect an entranco into Mcarthur, Boylc \& Campbell's oflico on Sunday. Tue arrival of the caretaker puta stop to their operations.

New P'ost Offices havo boen upened at Orange Lorlge, Afamucte Co., and at Baio St. Prul, Lisgar $C_{0}$. The postmastor at the former is Fid. Winter, ant at tha latier E. 1. Fairlanks.
Tuere has been great destruction of fish in the Shoal Jake district during the reeent cold spell; all the fish in the head waters of the stream running into tho lakes were frozen in and died.

A represestative of The; Commehcial who has just returned from Rat Portage brings us a grist of interesting news regarding the commercal and mining industrics of that district, which we are compelicd to hold over till next week.

Coneer \& Cormacas. boot and shoo dealcrs; in Winnipeg havo effected a settlement with their creditors at 90 c on the dollar, sesured. The firm were in a good possition and but for the importunity of one or two creditors could have paid a hundred cents on tho dollar.

Mr. Geo. A. Stewart, C.E., of this city, lias been making a survey of tho Morris rlver, with 2. view to calculate the water power that can bo obtained by damming the stream. Ho pronounces the schema as very feasible. Twentycight hundred horso power can bo had at all seasons of the year ; but for aix months of the year the flow of water would give nearly 10,000 horse power.

Last week we referred to tho necessity of protection of life and property from firc. No action has been taken as yet. Let something be done at once. Representatives whether in the Legislature or entrusted with the charge of municinal institutions should consider it fhoir solcmn duty to cnact lavs providing for the thorough inspection of all buildings to be ased for public purposes, such as hotels, theatres, cte. Safety has been too much risked to save costs, and there should be a suddien stop put to it.

TuE Wrestern Canada Loan and Savings Co., with headquarters in Toronto, is one of the most prosperous monetary institutions in the Dominion. In 1852, thoy declared semi-annual dividends at the rate of ten per cent. per ainum, and besides cariod $\$ 25,000$ to reserve, and placed $\$ 11,254$ to the credit of the contingent fund. Their branch office in Winnipeg, man aged by Mr. F. B, Ross, mhich was opened in Novomber last, has dono a very satisficictory busincess so far, and the directors look with great faror upon Manitoba as a field for operation.
