The foregoing represents the exportation of the various kinds of fish exported from ports in Manitoba and Northwest Territories, but cannot be said to represent the whole amount of fish which originated in these territorial divisions which was exported, as it is possible that some fish, the product of Manitoba and Northwest Territories, may have been exported at eastern points and is credited in the statistical returns to the port of exit by which it left Canada.

Mr. PATERSON. Suppose fish had been sent down and remained in bond and was taken from Montreal or Fort Erie, it would be credited to those ports.

Mr. FOSTER. That would be fairly accurate.
