THE BATTLE-FIELD

Is situated on the farms of Messrs. Lewis Gongaware and Lewis Wanamaker, in Penn township, Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania. From Munor, the most convenient station on the line of the Pennsylvania Railroad, the distance, in a northeastwardly direction, is about three miles.

The following eastward-bound trains will stop at Manor, at the times indicated in the parenthesis: Mail Train, (8:58 A. M.); Yough. Express, (9:08 A. M.); Uniontown Express, (4:52 P. M.); and Johnstown Accommodation (5:24 P. M.).

The following westward-bound trains will stop; Johnstown Accommodation (9:20 A. M.); Yough. Express, (5:22 P. M.); and Mail Train, (7:48 P. M.)

Excursion Tickets will be sold at Johnstown, Indiana, Fairchance, Pittsburgh, and all intermediate stations, and also on the Monongahela division, at regular excursion rates, good to return until Tuesday, August 7th, 1883.

N. B.—As indicated above the Youghiogheny Express will stop at Manor, August 6th, east and west-bound; the Uniontown Express, east-bound, in the evening, will also stop at Manor.

Lines of Hacks and Carriages will be run during the day to and from Manor. Special conveyances can be had at Greensburg, Irwin and Belmont.
