Conservative Leader Was Present on the Opening of the Great Northern Exhibition.

He Will Be Superseded by Sir Ernest Mason Satow, Minister at Tokio—Anti-Foreign Party is Growing in China.

London, Sept. 20.—(A.M.)—The only news of importance from China this morning is contained in a despatch to the Times from Shanghai dated yesterday, asserting that Sir Claude Maxwell Macdonald will become British Minister at Tokio and will be succeeded at Pekin by Sir Ernest Mason Satow.
