JUGGLER, 7 TO 1 SHOT, PUTS IT OVER STATESMAN

Fine Weather, Fast Track and
Large Crowd at Pimlico—
Lexington Results.

BALTIMORE, April 30.—Beautiful
weather brought a large crowd to
Pimlico today where a good day's
sport was had. The carded feature
was the Arlington steeplechase, which
went to the favorite, Balla Calla, in
an interesting race. The real feature
event was the mile race, when Jug-
ger, at 7 to 1, put it all over States-
man, touted as one of the best at the
track. The finish was a nose at
fair, and in the shuffle the favorite
was out of the money, crowded out
by Question Mark and Gowan. Wit-
ching Hour finished third in the second
race, but was disqualified for crowd-
ing in the stretch drive. The track
remains fast.
