Railway Commission Sends Official to Inquire Into Conditions.

CAR SHORTAGE ALLEGED

C. N. R. Says "Spotty" Crops and Bad Weather Cause Trouble.

By a Staff Reporter.
Ottawa, Ont., Nov. 22.—A large number of complaints have been received by the railway commission as to the scarcity of cars on the lines of the Canadian Northern Railway in the west with the result that, with full elevators, the farmers are in some instances unable to market their grain. The daily average of cars transported over the system is much lower than last year and the commission has sent deorge Spencer, its chief operating officer, to the west to look into the natice. scarcity of cars on the lines of the

ficer, to the west to look into the naticer.

The Canadian Northern accounts for the apparent falling off in efficiency in several ways. It points out that the crop last year was well distributed, therefore, the average distance of transportation was much less this year. This year the shorter hauls are comparatively few. The weather also has hindered transportation as well as loading by the farmers. When cars are placed and a few bushels put in the company can do nothing until the loading is completed.

The company also claims that the other traffic demands of the provinces have greatly increased. The railway commissioners point out that the car shortage is not confined to the lines of the Canadian Northern into western territory. The Canadian Pacific, for example, has an absolute car shortage in connection with the ele-
