## SEVEN HORSES WIN EIGHT HEATS ON CHRISTMAS DAY AT HILLCREST PARK

### Three Toronto Driving Club's Harness Races Still Undecided—Bad Afternoon for the Favorites.

Two thousand lovers of the harness horse spent an enjoyable Christmas afternoon at Hillcrest Park, tho not one of the three races went to a decision. Bertha Walsh, in the 2:10 pace, proved the only winner of two heats. It was a disastrous day for the favorites. Day Spring and Kitty Wilkes failed to get near the money, while Guy Boy landed only one heat.

The track was all that could be desired. Aconite has a heat to his credit in the 2:10 pace.

Three heats were trotted in the 2:17 race, Sanitel, Jean T. and Guy Boy each securing one.

Only two heats were contested in the 2:20 pace, Juliet Peer and Dan Forester each taking one.

What happened to Dayspring? Sold favorite at \$10 to the field at \$7 and \$8 for the first heat, and, the finishing in the race, was still favorite for the race before the second. He was the choice to win the first heat at 1 to 2, and for the second 2 to 3. But the story was different. Bertha Walsh, a consistent performer over the dirt, won the first heat

in the fastest time easily, and was just voted out by Aconite for the second. However, the effort was too much, and he was away back in the third, which Bertha Walsh won in a close finish with Mussel Shell.

The race today looks between Bertha Walsh and Aconite for the second.

The trot produced three different heat winners. Sanitel was off well and won the first without trouble. The second saw Jean T. away in her stride, opening a gap. Sanitel kept right after the mare, and it was nose at the wire. The third went to Guy Boy, that sold favorite for the race at \$10, field \$14. It was getting dark, and the start was delayed, and none too good, Jean T. not having much chance, Guy Boy also was off behind, but came round his field for a clever win.

It is an open race between the three heat winners.

Dan Forester won the first heat of the 2:20 pace so easily that it looked all over but the shouting. However, he slipped and didn't get away the second heat, which Juliet Peer won in a battle with Steve Ayres. Kitty Wilkes sold favorite in the pools, but went without her hopes and thus made a mistake. Lady Alice was also much in demand, but ran second to the luck. It looks an open race, with five of them having a chance.
