2. To how many schools and what other types of organizations were the kits distributed?
3. What was the total cost of preparation, publication and distribution of the kit and was the cost shared by any other levels of government?

Question No. 2,432—**Mr. Cossitt:**

1. (a) Is Mr. Robert Kingsley, Canada Manpower Regional Manager of Operations, working out of Ottawa and, if not, what is his exact title and duties (b) on what date was he appointed to this position?
2. What are all former positions held by Mr. Kingsley in government service and the dates and specifically did these include Manager of the Ottawa Office of the Unemployment Insurance Commission and Regional Manager of the Unemployment Insurance Commission Pay Centre in Montreal?
3. Is Mr. Dennis Kingsley, brother of Mr. Robert Kingsley, presently employed by the Unemployment Insurance Commission and is he stationed at the Head Office of UIC at 222 Nepean St., Ottawa and, if so, in what capacity?

4. Has an investigation been taking place of alleged defrauding of the Unemployment Insurance Commission by Mrs. Robert Kingsley and does this investigation include looking into completed UIC reporting cards sent in by Mrs. Kingsley making claims against the Unemployment Insurance Commission while Mrs. Kingsley was absent from the country on a vacation or trip and, if so (a) how many weeks of benefits were paid to Mrs. Kingsley that should not have been paid (b) what was the total sum of money involved?

5. Has an investigation been taking place of alleged defrauding of the UIC by a son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kingsley and does this investigation include looking into completed UIC reporting cards sent in by this individual making claims against UIC while he was a student, unavailable for work and, if so (a) how many weeks of benefits were paid to him that should not have been paid (b) what was the total sum of money involved?

6. Has this entire matter been referred to senior officials of UIC in Belleville or elsewhere with a recommendation that charges be laid and, if so (a) what are the names and job designations of all those recommending such charges (b) what are the names and job designations of all those considering such a recommendation (c) will charges be laid and, if so (i) on what date (ii) against whom (iii) what is the nature of the charges?

7. Has the investigation in any way whatsoever involved either Mr. Robert Kingsley or Mr. Dennis Kingsley and, if so, what part did either play in the matter?

Hon. Bud Cullen (Minister of Manpower and Immigration): In so far as the Unemployment Insurance Commission and the Department of Manpower and Immigration are concerned: 1. (a) No. He is District Director, Manpower Division, Ottawa District Office. Under general direction of the Assistant Director General Manpower of the Ontario Region, Canada Man-
