HOT WEATHER IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, July 18 - The crest of the hot wave that reached town yesterday touched this summer's record mark of 89 at noon today. Then the temperature dropped to 75 this evening, where it stood at midnight. The humidity, however, continued excessive throughout the day, and well into the night, causing much suffering.

Three deaths were reported to the police as having been due directly or indirectly to the heat and humidity, while some 50 cases of prostration were treated at the hospitals.

BOSTON, Mass., July 18 - In the suburban towns the heat also claimed two victims. Mrs. Mary Gorman dying in East Braintree and T. Murine, in the hospital in Quincy.
